THE VALLEY & THE PASTURE Pastor Paul Shumaker

We are in that season. The post-Christmas, cold and flu, dark winter, pandemic season. We are in the season of the valley that Psalm 23 tells us about. We are living through a heavy time. A time of uncertainty a time where there is no shortage of voices telling us what to think and what to do. It may seem like a dark valley to you, and I want you to know that I hear you.

We are living through a time where everyone is feeling something. Pain and loss is coming out sideways. Even though frustration and irritability are commonplace, now they seem to be amplified. Relationships that we once filled with understand and compassion are now messy.

But here is the hope that perhaps you need to hear today, I know it is the hope I need to hear today. Messy is what we do! Messy is what the church is supposed to be good at! Messy is real life and real struggles and real hurts! You and I, we are the church, we are God's church and messy is what we do!

We don't always do it well, and sometimes we lose sight of the fact that we, as the church, are supposed to be right in the thick of the mess, proclaiming - God is with you!

In this season of darkness and valleys your God is here with you! I pray that you know that, that you find hope in that gift. Now more than ever we need to be that messy church together. Where we can support one another in the midst of philosophical differences. Where we can say that we are a part of the body of Christ as imperfect as we are. Your care and support are needed now more than ever.

It has been a very difficult time to be church. More than any other time, we have seen every decision that we have made scrutinize with animosity. If we ask people to mask, some are relieved while others are angered. If we do nothing, some are angry while others go on as if nothing is happening at all.

Recently our church council asked everyone to mask as a part of a request by our medical facilities. Now this request is only for a short time, and we know through studies that it will actually save lives. Real human lives.

In any other time in our history that would be enough for this worshipping body to come together to do what we can for the least of these. Unfortunately, the valley we are in is a deep one. It is frustrating, it is hard, and it is challenging. We are called to do what we can for each other and right now in this valley that means doing some things we don't particularly like. We need to come together now more than ever. I am pleading with you to wear a mask, please prayerfully consider getting vaccinated and above all be kind to one another.

This is messy. May we as God's messy church and messy people do the work that we are called to. May we roll up our sleeves and get to the work of loving one another even when we don't particularly like each other very much. Being a follower of Christ is messy, having faith in uncertain times is challenging. Know that this church, your church is ready to get messy with you!

Psalm 23 goes on to remind us of the green pastures, the comfort of our Creator and of God's goodness and mercy. We will one day get through this valley, it will happen! God's church, God's people, have walked through many valleys, this is not new. One day we will look back over this valley from the splendor of the green pastures. My prayer is that we will be filled with pride, hope and gratitude at how we weathered the valley and cared for all of God's precious sheep!

He leads me in right paths for his name's sake. ⁴Even though I walk through the darkest valley, I fear no evil; for you are with me; they comfort me. ⁵You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies; you anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows. ⁶Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life, and I shall dwell in the house of the LORD my whole life long. Psalm 23
