

LENTEN WORHSIP OFFERINGS

Did you know that during Lent our Midweek Lenten worship offerings are split between three worthy causes! They are shared between Lutheran Disaster Response, Good Neighbor Fund and Camp House Matching Fund!

Lutheran Disaster Response: Lutheran Disaster Response shares God's hope, healing and renewal with people whose lives have been disrupted by disasters in the United States and around the world. When the dust settles and the headlines change, LDR stays to provide ongoing assistance to those in need. Some of the many areas LDR supports are: Middle East Crisis, Hurricane Response, U.S. Flooding, Wildfires, Eastern Europe Refugee Crisis and so much more!

Good Neighbor Fund: Is the PLC Fund that is used for those in our community that are in need of immediate financial support. These dollars are used for food, short term lodging, diapers, formula, medications and whatever else that might be an immediate need.

Camp House Matching Fund: This year as we focus on "filling the Camp!" with our youth, adults and families we are also keenly aware that the cost of camp does not even come close to the amount of money it costs to operate this vital ministry. For each dollar that we spend to send a person to camp PLC as committed to matching those dollars as a gift GLLM as our ministry partner so that this life giving ministry will continue its important work well into the future!
